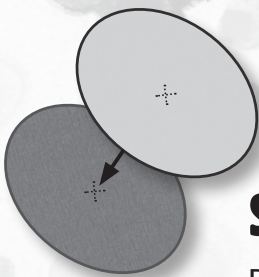


MAKE YOUR OWN PAPER FLOWER!

By 1933 it was estimated that one in three Australian breadwinners were unemployed. Bank failures, collapse of investment, falling commodity prices and reduction of trade resulted in mounting unemployment particularly in the manufacturing and building industries. The enterprising jobless devised novel ways of earning money and began to refer to themselves as 'self-employed' rather than 'unemployed'. Some jobless men made and sold paper flowers on street corners to raise much needed income.

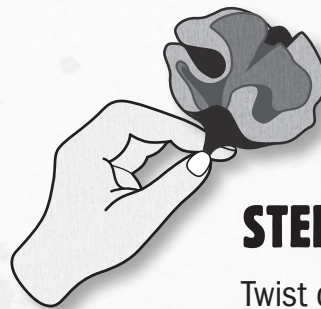
Imagine you are on the breadline and make your own paper flower to sell.

You will need: one 100mm-diameter circle and one 150mm-diameter circle cut from white or coloured tissue paper, and a pipe-cleaner.



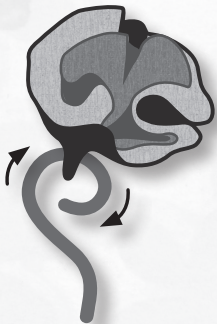
STEP 1

Place one paper circle on top of the other.



STEP 2

Twist centres of circles together.



STEP 3

Wrap one end of pipe-cleaner around twisted paper.



STEP 4

Twist remainder of pipe-cleaner around your wrist.
